**Sub: Intimation with regard to the decision of the Standing Committee of Bar Council of India allowing the request regarding reduction of intake capacity from two sections to one section in each of 5-year B.B.A. LL.B and 3-year LL.B. course and granting extension of approval of affiliation to Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Rohtas for imparting 3-year LL.B degree course and 5-year B.B.A. LL.B. integrated course with intake of one section of 60 students in each section in each course AND 5-year B.A. LL.B. integrated course with intake of two sections of 60 students in each section for the academic year 2026-27 subject to compliance of Rules of Legal Education, 2008 and all circulars/directives/guidelines/notifications issued from time to time by the Bar Council of India with respect to maintenance of standards of Legal Education.**

This is to bring to your kind knowledge that the Standing Committee of the Legal Education Committee of the Bar Council of India in its meeting dated 12.4.2026 has considered the letter dated 8.1.2026 received from Registrar, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Rohtas requesting to reduce the intake capacity from two sections to one section in each of 5-year B.B.A. LL.B and 3-year LL.B. course because once of the two sanctioned sections each of the aforesaid course has remained unutilized since inception.
