3. NOTES RELATED TO MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT

- (i) Candidate shall be admitted in a course according to merit drawn on the basis of aggregate marks secured in the Entrance Test provided he/she fulfills the minimum eligibility criteria and minimum qualifying marks in the Entrance Test.
- (ii) Candidates appearing in the Final Year of the Qualifying Examination may also apply and appear in the Test. However, the candidate will be required to produce the original mark sheet of the qualifying examination at the time of provisional admission.
- However, the admission can be allowed on the condition that:**
- Such candidates should give an undertaking that they will produce the original mark sheet of the qualifying examination with minimum eligibility requirement within fortnight of provisional admission.
- (iii) If the applicant has passed the qualifying exam where grades are awarded and:
- (a) Where the Grade Sheet does not mention the equivalent percentage of marks from grade points, the candidate should submit such a Certificate of conversion from the concerned Institution mentioning either the converted percentage, or the formula for the actual conversion of grade point average to percentage of marks;
- (b) Where the Grade Sheet itself mentions the equivalent percentage of marks from grade points, or the formula for such conversion, the candidate should get both sides of the Degree/Grade Sheet photocopied showing the equivalent percentage of marks/conversion formula.
- (iv) "Aggregate percentage of marks" will also include grace marks awarded to a candidate. The percentage of marks in the aggregate will be computed as evidenced from the final mark sheet of the qualifying examination.
- (v) (a) Degrees/Certificates recognized by Association of Indian Universities (AIU) shall only be deemed as equivalent degrees/certificates.
- (b) The Distance Education Council of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)/Association of Indian Universities (AIU) will be the only authority to recognize the Degrees/Certificates of Distance Education. Such candidates may be provisionally permitted to appear in the Entrance Tests but will be required to submit certificates from Distance Education Council of IGNOU, New Delhi regarding recognition/approval of the courses.
- (c) The courses at the level of 10+2 of Madarsa recognized by Bihar State Madarsa Education Board /Jamia Milia Islamia, New Delhi (Central University) will be recognized for purposes of admission to the concerned subject to fulfillment of the required other eligibility.
- (d) The courses at the level of 10+2 of Board recognized by Bihar State Sanskrit Education Board, or other equivalent Board, New Delhi will be recognized for purposes of admission to the concerned subject to fulfillment of the required other eligibility.
- (vi). Notwithstanding anything contained in the Prospectus of Studies regarding the Courses in which admission is made through Entrance Test, the eligibility requirements for the purpose of admission shall be only those which are mentioned in the Information Bulletin of the academic session concerned.
- (vii) Candidates are allowed to appear at the Entrance Tests provisionally subject to the final verification of Mark sheets/Degrees/Certificates, validity of Certificates/Mark sheets of Qualifying Examination and also of non-involvement in the adoption of unfair means in any of the University Examinations/Entrance Tests held earlier, at the time of admission.

(viii) Mere appearance in the Entrance Test or securing pass marks at the Entrance Test does not entitle a candidate to be considered for admission to the Course unless he/she fulfils the eligibility conditions.

APPLICANTS MUST FULLY SATISFY THEMSELVES ABOUT THEIR ELIGIBILITY AS PRESCRIBED ABOVE, BEFORE FILLING IN THE APPLICATION FORM.

(ix) If an applicant is inadvertently allowed to appear at the Entrance Test who otherwise does not fulfill the minimum eligibility requirements, he/she cannot, at a later date, use that as right to claim that he/she meets the eligibility requirements.

The University reserves the right to cancel/refuse admission at any point of time if it is found that:

- I. Minimum eligibility requirements are not fulfilled.
- II. False documentation have been done, or, facts have been suppressed.
- III. Any other similar valid reason.

(x) Candidates admitted to any Course in this University shall not be eligible to pursue simultaneously any other full-time Course in this or in any other University/Institution.

(xi) A candidate can apply for any number of courses for which he/she is eligible, provided that the Entrance Tests were arranged at different time schedules.

4. RESERVATIONS

(i) Reservation for SC, ST, EBC, OBC, OBC (Mahila), Persons with Disability and Economically Weaker Sections under General category shall be as under:

(i) Schedule Caste	: 16%	} of the prescribed intake on horizontal basis within general category
(ii) Schedule Tribe	: 01%	
(iii) Extremely Back Ward Class	: 18%	
(iv) Other Back Ward Class	: 12%	
(v) Mahila (Other Back Ward)	: 03%	
(vi) Persons with Disability Class	: 05%	
(vii) Economically Weaker Sections	: 10%	

➤ Admission against these seats will be made provided the candidate has passed the Qualifying Examination with required passing marks as mentioned against each course at point no.1 above, and qualified the Entrance Test.

➤ Every SC/ST/EBC/OBC (Mahila)/EWS candidate shall have to submit a self-attested copy of the Certificate as a proof.

The following are empowered to issue the certificate:

- (a) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- (b) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.

The Caste Certificate should clearly state:

- (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe.
 - (b) District and the State or Union Territory of his/her usual place of residence.
 - (c) Category to which candidate belongs.
- (ii) Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) In accordance with O.M.F.No.12-4/2019-U1 dated 17th January 2019 of the Department of Higher Education, MHRD, Government of India, 10% reservation for Economically Weaker Sections shall be provided in admission during the Academic Session 2022-23.

5. Persons with Disability:

In the case of Persons with Disability: 5% seats shall be reserved for Persons with Disability Candidates on horizontal basis: (a) blindness and low vision; (1%) + (b) deaf and hard of hearing; (1%) + (c) locomotors disability including cerebral palsy, leprosy cured, dwarfism, acid attack victims and muscular dystrophy; (1%) + (d) autism, intellectual disability, specific learning disability and mental illness; (1%) + (e) multiple disabilities from amongst persons under clauses (a) to (d) including deaf-blindness in the posts identified for each disabilities: (1%) (on horizontal reservation basis). Such candidates will have to submit a self-attested copy of Disability Certificate issued by the District CMO/ Civil Surgeon/ Medical Superintendent of a Government Health Care Institution with the Application Form.

Candidates who request the University for providing Scribe shall be allotted a Entrance Test Centre in the University Campus, Jamuhar, Sasaram only.

Note:

“Compensatory time” of 20 minutes per hour of examination for persons who are allowed use of scribe would be provided. All the candidates with benchmark disability not availing the facility of scribe would also be allowed additional time of 20 minutes per hour of examination. The Physically Challenged candidates called for provisional admission will be examined by a Medical Board of the Gopal Narayan Singh University, if necessary.

The decision of the Medical Board constituted by GNSU will be final.

6. INSTITUTIONAL PREFERENCE:

Institutional preference will be given to graduate passed out from the Gopal Narayan Singh University against 25% out of the total seats prescribed for that particular discipline.

7. APPLICATION PROCESSING/ENTRANCE TEST FEE

The Candidate shall pay the following Entrance Test fee:

In case a candidate prefers to be considered for more than one course for which there are separate/common entrance tests, he/ she shall apply for each such course separately (See schedule of Entrance Tests). However, in case the candidate makes application (fills up application form) for more than one course under University Entrance Test- 2023, the Application Processing Fee/Entrance Test Fee payable by him/her for each subsequent application (after first application). Mode of Payment of Application Processing/Entrance Test Fee Candidate is required to fill up the Entrance Test Application Form ONLINE. After the candidate has filled up the application form online, he/she will have following options for payment of Application Processing/Entrance Test Fee:

- Online payment through credit card/ debit card through the payment gateway available on the Entrance Test portal.
- Payment of Entrance Test Fee in Cash through “Challan” in any branch of **HDFC Bank**.

8. University Entrance Tests for admission to all programme will be held in the Campus of the Gopal Narayan Singh University or at other centers as decided by the University from time to time (if any).

9. Dates for Offline/Online University Entrance Test will be communicated later on.

10. ADMISSION OF FOREIGN NATIONALS

Foreign Nationals:

Provision to the extent of 15% supernumerary seats for Foreign Nationals exist under ICCR Scholarship Scheme or Self-financing scheme, out of which 5% seats will be filled up by children of

NRIs [Persons of Indian Origin (PIO)] and 5% by children of Indian workers in Gulf and South Asian Countries. The details about this may be obtained from the Office of the Registrar, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Jamuhar, Sasram, Bihar- 821305. (Visit our GNSU website: www.gnsu.ac.in)

A. The degree possessed by the foreign candidates shall be considered by the **EQUIVALENCE COMMITTEE** of the concerned faculty before their admission.

B. English Proficiency certificate of **TOEFL (minimum 70 marks) or IELTS (Minimum 6 bands) score is mandatory for foreign candidates at the time of submission of application form for the admission to UG/PG./Diploma Programme in the University.** In absence of these scores/certificate or English Proficiency certificate, the candidate shall have to appear in the English Proficiency test to be conducted by Office of the Controller of Examinations of the Gopal Narayan Singh University. The candidate has to clear Intermediate level course and need an overall minimum score of 40% to confirm admission.

PROCEDURE OF ADMISSION

Self-Financing Candidates

1. Download and print the application form from the University website. After filling the online registration form in all respect, attach all the required certificates and the draft for the prescribed processing fee and send it to the Office of the Registrar, Gopal Narayan Singh University, India so as to reach this office on or before the last date prescribed for submission of the application form. The candidates are advised to check carefully the eligibility criteria before filling application form for Admission in any course.
2. After scrutinized of the application, and if found eligible, the candidate will be sent the provisional eligibility / admission letter through email.
3. After getting the provisional admission letter, the candidate has to apply to the Indian Embassy in his country for issuance of proper **Student's Visa, endorsed in the name of Gopal Narayan Singh University.** No other type of Visa shall be acceptable for the purpose of admission.
4. On acquiring the Student Visa, the candidate has to report for admission to the department concerned of the Gopal Narayan Singh University within the period prescribed in the provisional admission letter.
5. The admission of Foreign Nationals will be confirmed only after verification of original certificates, medical fitness test, Student Visa issued for the Programme and payment of required fees.

Under ICCR Scholarship Schemes:

Foreign National shall have to involve following steps for admission under Indian Council for Cultural Relations Scholarship Scheme to any programme in the Gopal Narayan Singh University:

1. The prescribed application form of ICCR available at the Indian embassy in their respective country to be filled up and submitted along with all the necessary documents, certificates etc.
2. If admission and scholarship is offered to them, they get the information from the Indian Embassy in their country.
3. They should get proper **Student's Visa, endorsed in the name of Gopal Narayan Singh University** from the embassy.

4. On acquiring the Student Visa, the candidate has to report for admission to the department concerned of the Gopal Narayan Singh University within the period prescribed in the provisional admission letter.

5. The admission of International students will be confirmed only after verification of original certificates, medical fitness test, Student Visa and payment of required fees.
