Sub.: Extension of approval to Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Jamuhar, Sasaram, Rohtas, Bihar for imparting three year LLB Course, five year BA LL.B course and five year BBA LL.B course with intake of one section of 60 students in each course for the academic session 2021-2022.

Sir,

The Hon'ble High Court of Patna, in the matter of Kunal Kaushal Versus State Bar Council (CWJC No. 3636 of 2019) vide its Order dated 6.9.2021 had directed for re-inspection of the interested colleges/CLEs. Accordingly, your College/CLE had applied for re-inspection and inspection was done and inspection report was placed before the Standing Committee in its meeting dated 11th and 12th September, 2021 and decision of Standing Committee was placed before the Hon'ble High Court. The Hon'ble High Court vide its Order dated 19.01.2022 has confirmed the decision taken by the Standing Committee with respect of your College/CLE.

This is to bring to your kind knowledge that the Standing Committee of Bar Council of India by virtue of its meeting held on 11th and 12th September, 2021 considered the matter of extension of approval to Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Jamuhar, Sasaram, Rohtas, Bihar for imparting three year LLB course, five year BA LL.B course and five year BBA LL.B course.

After consideration, Committee has observed that CLE requires 39 qualified faculty in Law for existing courses and 26 Classrooms whereas CLE has 37 qualified faculty in Law and 26 Classrooms. Considering the number of students admitted in each course every year and overall infrastructure, Committee recommends to reduce the strength of the existing courses to 1 section in each course.
