

The Student Grievance Redressal Committee

The Bar Council of India (BCI) has emphasized the establishment of a robust mechanism for redressal of student grievances in every Centre for Legal Education. All students admitted to the Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University are hereby informed that any grievance relating to academic, administrative, or infrastructural matters may be formally submitted to the Student Grievance Redressal Committee (SGRC) for prompt and fair resolution.

The Student Grievance Redressal Committee aims to:

1. Address grievances of students concerning academic, administrative and infrastructure matters.
2. Provide a transparent and accessible mechanism for grievance resolution.
3. Ensure fairness and accountability in resolving student issues in compliance with the standards prescribed by the Bar Council of India.

Procedure for Filing Grievances:

1. Students are required to submit their grievances in writing to the SGRC, either physically or through the official email address.
2. Grievances must include all relevant details, including supporting documents, to facilitate proper resolution.
3. The SGRC will review and resolve complaints within a specified timeframe, ensuring transparency and accountability.

Resolution Process:

1. The SGRC shall convene within seven working days of receiving a grievance.
2. The complainant and concerned parties shall be given an opportunity to present their case.
3. The SGRC must ensure confidentiality, impartiality and adherence to principles of natural justice during the proceedings.
4. A resolution must be communicated to the complainant in writing within fifteen working days of the hearing.

Appeal Mechanism:

If a complainant is dissatisfied with the decision of the SGRC, they may appeal to the Bar Council of India.

Any student who wishes to file a grievance can contact the Chairperson of the Student Grievance Redressal Committee (CGRC) of Narayan School of Law.

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


