About 1st Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition, 2022

The 1st Deo Mangal Memorial National Moot Court Competition 2022 has been successfully organised by the Moot Court Society, Narayan School of Law, Gopal Narayan Singh University, Jamuhar, Bihar. The Competition has been conceived with a dual objective, first to commemorate the extraordinary life of the Late Shri Deo Narayan Singh and Late Shrimati Mangala Devi who are the inspiration behind this university and secondly to celebrate the 5th foundation day of the Narayan School of law which falls on 7th October. With these objectives in mind, registrations were started from the Independence Day this year (15th Aug 2022). Moot Court Society received an overwhelming response from across the country so much so that it had to close down the registration process well before the last date, which was 30th September. Many leading law institutions of eminence which include CLC, Delhi University, Faculty of law Jamia Millia Islamia, Nalsar Hyderabad, RGNLU, HNLU, Symbiosis, Amity University, Calcutta University, Sastra University Tamil Nadu etc had participated in the competition. The organising committee closed registration at eighty universities. Out of 80 registered teams, 77 finally submitted their memorials and 74 teams finally participated in preliminary rounds which were held on 14 Oct 2022. The Competition was inaugurated by Hon'ble Mr Justice Arijit Pasayat, Former Judge, the Supreme Court of India. He addressed the audience and underlined the importance of Moot court activities. Other luminaries present at the inaugural function were Hon'ble Mr. Justice Anil Upadhyay, Judge, Patna High Court, who joined the function virtually. Shri Gopal Narayan Singh, Chancellor, Gopal Narayan Singh University. Prof (Dr) Harikrishna Singh, Visitor of Gopal Narayan Singh University Prof. Jagdish Singh, Pro VC, Gopal Narayan Singh University. Prof Dr Rakesh Verma, Director, Narayan School of Law welcomed the dignitaries. With the Permission of a Visitor of the University, the courts went live for the preliminary rounds. The competition went through several stages such as the preliminary round, Quater Final, Semi Final and final. More than 120 professionals such as lawyers, academicians, legal entrepreneurs, Researchers, and directors of legal institutions were roped in from across the country to judge these rounds. The participation of colleges and judges from every nook and corner of the country made this competition truly 'National' in every sense of the term. We have also witnessed the great spirit of inter- University collaboration as around ten volunteers from Integral University, Lucknow participated in organising this event. After going through various stages, the competition reached the finals where the audience witnessed the pinnacles of the art of advocacy by the finalist teams.

REPORT ON MASS COOKING DEMONSTRATION

We the Community Health Nursing Department. Narayan Nursing College. Gopal Narayan Singh University have conducted a mass cooking demonstration in the Ghamariya Village. AkodiGola as a part of the requirement for the first year GNM students on 20 July 2023 With the Blessings of Prof. Dr. Latha K. Dean cum Principal. Prof. Dr. Shaveta Sharma, Vice Principal, Prof. Dr. Lisy Joseph, HOD dept of Nursing Research, the programme was planned on 20" July 2023, Thursday from 10am to 4 pm. 100 students of GNM 18 year executed the mass cooking demonstration under the supervision of Mr. Mohammed Rafi. Asst. Prof. Dept of CoHN, Mr. Mohammed Umar, M.Sc. Nursing. Tutor, Ms. Shweta Kumari, M.Sc. Nursing Tutor, Mr. Dipu Kumar, M.Sc. Nursing, 15 year Student. Dept of Community Health Nursing. The community training in the village of the GNM 15 year was given for three weeks from 15 July and when the students performed basic under five assessments, they found the out of 200 children assessed 82(41%) were mild-moderately malnourished. This made the students to plan a mass cooking demonstration with a menu rich in protein and energy content. The menu included sattu puri, mix-veg sabzi and shoji halwa, each platter comprising of 280Kcal of energy and 53gms of protein wherein 250Kcal of energy and 10gms of protein per meal is required as per the recommended dietary allowance for children under 6 years as advised by the India Council of Medical Research (ICMR).
