



Awareness pamphlets and educational leaflets were distributed focusing on hygiene, nutrition, and NCD prevention.


Early identification of hypertension and anemia cases led to timely referral and follow-up at nearby health centers.

They learned to interact with people from diverse socio-economic backgrounds, building empathy and understanding of rural health challenges.


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

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Key learning outcomes included:

Key Observations:

- Crops were healthy, with minimal signs of pest infestation.
- The use of drip irrigation reduced water usage significantly.
- Crop rotation was practiced to prevent soil depletion and reduce disease occurrence.

Farmers' Feedback:

Many farmers appreciated the practicality of organic methods and expressed interest in adopting composting. Some showed concern about the initial labor required for compost preparation.

Conclusion:

The field visit was a valuable learning opportunity for the farmers. They gained insights into sustainable farming techniques that can improve productivity while protecting the environment. The group expressed gratitude to ATMA Rohtas and Narayan Institute of Agricultural Sciences and requested more regular learning visits.


Outcome and Feedback

- **Mr. Mohit Kumar Gupta** effectively coordinated the overall event.


Students of **GNM II Year** and **B.Sc. (N) VI Semester**, along with faculty members, actively participated in the event. The key message delivered to all participants was:


Brief Report:

Camp Experience



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
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IIT Mandi Catalyst Workshop on New Business Plan

The **IIT Mandi Catalyst Workshop on New Business Plan**, held at **Gopal Narayan Singh University (GNSU)**, was a two-day hands-on training program aimed at nurturing entrepreneurial thinking and innovation among students and faculty members. Organized jointly by **IIT Mandi Catalyst**, the Technology Business Incubator of IIT Mandi, and **GNSU's Department of Management and Entrepreneurship Development Cell**, the workshop focused on **designing value propositions and developing viable business models**. The program guided participants through the key stages of creating a successful startup plan — from ideation and customer need identification to business model development and market validation. Participants worked in interactive groups to refine their startup ideas, applying structured frameworks such as the **Business Model Canvas**. The workshop also highlighted the pathways for selected ideas to receive mentoring and incubation support from IIT Mandi Catalyst, thus bridging the gap between academic learning and real-world entrepreneurship. 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
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
