PREAMBLE

M/s ITECHDREAMS (Hereafter referred to as the "COMPANY")

GOPAL NARAYAN SINGH UNIVERSITY (Hereafter referred to as the "UNIVERSITY)

Situated at JAMUHAR, ROHTAS, BIHAR is one of the 7 private universities in Bihar with a lush green campus of more than 75 acres and more than 3800 students getting a global academic environment. It is located at Jamuhar, Sasaram, Rohtas in Bihar. The University has an objective of providing quality education. The University has been started with a vision to build technology professionals with a practical Industry expossionals with a practical Industry.

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- This MOU is between the Company and the University, with a primary objective of "Industry Educational Institutional Interface" on continuing basis for mutual cooperation and benefit for achieving a harmonious blend of strengths from both sides.
- This MOU covers the following functions paving way for the institute-industry link for TRAINING of students in sites/Training centre of the Company. The University students will be deputed for practical training to the Company.
- 1.1 Following are the areas where we propose to work together to achieve the objectives:

THE PRACTICE SCHOOL PROGRAMME (PSP)

- THE UNIVERSITY, the pioneers in conceptualizing a unique Practice School Program aimed at bridging the gap between Industry and Academics by building Industry Ready Engineering/Technical Workforce, would like to work in collaboration with the Company to further benefit the Final year Engineering, BCA and MCA students and act as a stepping stone for their bright careers.
- The Programme includes **ON-THE-JOB-TRAINING** which fulfils the academic requirement of students of Bachelor of Technology (B. Tech), Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) and Master of Computer Application (MCA) degree. Joint monitoring will be done for the regular development of the students' at the site offices of the Company from time to time by Technical Guide and the Company Guide as mutually agreed by both the parties.

1.2ADJUNCT COURSES

a) The foundation laid down in the academic curriculum has to be complemented by certain practical training which can deepen the understanding of a student. Based on the feedback from leading Academicians and Industry leaders, the Company has accepted to impart practical on-the-job training to the students of the University.

The Company may provide some theoretical inputs to the students with an objective to provide the students an opportunity to learn and practice the most updated technologies relevant from Industry point of view. This would enable the students to gain specialised skill in their domain area so that the students will be more equipped with appropriate knowledge and skills to take esponsible positions in the

companies.

- b) The adjunct course is nothing but practical training imparted to the student/participant to enable him/her to gain specialized skill in his/her domain area so that the student/participant will be more equipped with knowledge and practice.
- c) After the training is completed, the Company agrees to provide a certificate to the student.

1.3 PRACTICAL TRAINING AND PROGRAMS

- a) The Company shall conduct PRACTICE SCHOOL PROGRAM in association with the the University. The on-the-job training will be a value addition to the students as they will learn practices of the industry.
- b) The practical training will be given in the Company in the disciplines and areas according to university norms and regulations.
- c) It is also agreed that (i) the total duration of training programme will not exceed one semester period, (ii) starting date and ending date of the programme is decided by the University and (iii) the Company will participate in different evaluation components of Practice School Program as per the criteria laid down by the University.
- d) The Company would facilitate the student to interact with their officials to understand the processes of the organization.

1.4 TERMS OF TRAINING

- a) The duration of the Practice School Program is one semester.
- b) The calendar for the training shall be sent by the University.
- c) The students or the University shall not claim any compensation from the Company during the said training. However, the Company may decide to compensate the students by way of stipend, incentive, allowances, etc. to motivate them for value addition.
- d) The number of students to be trained in each semester in the Company will be decided by the Company itself. The number of students can vary depending on the availability of students and infrastructural facilities at the Company.
- e) The deputation of students to the Company is dependent on the availability of students and their interest to pursue the engagement. As such the University is not under obligation to depute the students as desired by the Company.

f) The students who are deputed to the Company and the University shall maintain strict

done by the student is worthy of academic communication by way of a paper or research report, it may be published with prior written approval of the Company and with due acknowledgments.

- g) The Company shall allow the Technical Guide and any other faculty members or Officers of the University to visit the Company for meetings/review of the student performance with prior appointment.
- h) The Company shall permit the students for participation in technical conferences, seminars, symposia, panel discussions, etc. for knowledge acquisition.
- i) The Company shall allow the students, during the training period, upon the request of the University, to participate in campus/off-campus placement drives to facilitate employment of the students.

1.5 VALIDITY

The MoU is valid for a period of two years with effect from the date of signing of the agreement and may be renewed after that period, incorporating mutually agreeable modifications, if any, thereafter.

The agreement cannot be withdrawn in the middle of the course, currently in progress. However, either party may withdraw from the agreement by giving a written notice of six months in advance, subject to fulfilment of prior obligations otherwise surviving.

Both the Parties will implement the above terms and conditions effectively and both parties will review the functioning of the MoU every Six months.

1.6 FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party shall be liable for non-performance either in whole or in part of this agreement due to reasons unforeseen and beyond its control. These reasons shall include and be limited to strikes, lockouts, nationalization, acts of God, war and fire. In that event, the other party will be notified immediately in writing detailing full facts of the case and both parties will endeavour to arrive at mutually satisfactory solutions to overcome the difficulties arising out of these circumstances.

1.7 NON-DISCLOSURE

Except in relation to information that is already in the public domain or required by law, or necessary for the performance of its obligations under this MoU and is accordingly disclosed to its respective officers, employees, representatives or agents, each Party shall not, without the written consent of the other party, directly or indirectly disclose to any other person, use or permit to be disclosed for any purpose other than that ordinated by this MoU, any information that is acquired to the other party's

affairs under this MoU, or as a consequence of the party's collaboration and must keep all such information strictly confidential and ensure that its officers, employees, representatives and agents keep any such information confidential.

1.8 ARBITRATION

The Company and the University shall settle any dispute arising out of any clause of this AGREEMENT through mutual consultations between the Company and the University. In case a settlement is not arrived at, such dispute(s) will be subjected to the provisions of the Arbitration & Conciliation Act, 1996.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

1. Roles and Responsibilities

The proposed roles and responsibilities of the parties in connection with this proposed business relationship are described in Attachment 1.

2. Termination

This MOU will terminate on 3 years from the date of signing unless extended or terminated earlier. If at any time any party wishes to withdraw from further evaluations and discussions in connection with the subject matter of this MOU and terminate this MOU, it may do so with or without cause and without liability by providing the other party with written notice of its intention to withdraw from further evaluation and discussions. All discussions, proposals, term sheets, draft agreements and other similar materials will be null and void if evaluations and discussions are terminated. This MOU can be extended upon written agreement of the parties.

3. Confidentiality

The existence and substance of this MOU and the provision of services contemplated hereby will be kept confidential and will not be disclosed to any party hereto to any third party without the prior written consent of the other party hereto. Notwithstanding the foregoing, any party may make such public disclosure as it believes, on the advice of counsel, is required by law or by applicable stock exchange regulations, in which case such party will consult with the other party and gain such party's written approval prior to making such disclosure.

The parties acknowledge that the exchange of confidential information by Gopal Narayan Singh University and IBM in connection with this MOU will be governed by the terms and conditions of that certain Agreement for Exchange of Confidential Information, attached hereto as Attachment 2.

In no event will either party be liable for any lost profits, lost savings, incidental damages, or other economic consequential damages, even if advised of the possibility of such damages. In addition, neither party will be liable for any damages claimed by the other party based on any third-party claim.

5. Publicity

IBM and Gopal Narayan Singh University each agrees not to use the trademarks, trade names, services marks or other proprietary marks of the other party to this MOU in any advertising, press releases, publicity matters, or other promotional materials without prior written approval of the other party. In addition each party agrees not to initiate or distribute any press releases, publicity matters or other promotional materials related to or referencing the subject matter of this MOU without prior written approval of the other party.

6. Governing Law

This Memorandum of Understanding shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of India, without regard to its conflict of laws provision.

7. General

Nothing contained in this MOU will be deemed to grant any ownership in, or license to, any patents, inventions, copyrights or trademarks of either party, whether made under this MOU or not. Each party will own any intellectual property created by it during the period of the MOU. In case a party wants to use the other party's intellectual property as created above for internal purposes, it would have to acquire appropriate licenses and rights from the other party, under a separate agreement. Each party will continue to own any pre-existing material contributed by it.

Agreement for Exchange of Confidential Information

- use the Discloser's Information for the purpose for which it was disclosed or otherwise for the benefit of the Discloser.

The Recipient may disclose Information to:

- Its employees who have a need to know, and employees of any legal entity that it controls, controls it, or with which it is under common control, who have a need to know. Control means to own or control, directly or indirectly, over 50% of voting shares; and
- 2) Any other party with the Discloser's prior written consent.

Before disclosure to any of the above parties, the Recipient will have a written agreement with the party sufficient to require that party to treat Information in accordance with this Agreement.

The Recipient may disclose Information to the extent required by law. However, the Recipient will give the Discloser prompt notice to allow the Discloser a reasonable opportunity to obtain a protective order.

3. Confidentiality Period

Information disclosed under this Agreement will be subject to this Agreement for two years following the initial date of disclosure.

4. Exceptions to Obligations

The Recipient may disclose, publish, disseminate, and use Information that is:

- 1) already in its possession without obligation of confidentiality;
- 2) developed independently;
- 3) obtained from a source other than the Discloser without obligation of confidentiality;
- 4) publicly available when received, or subsequently becomes publicly available through no fault of the Recipient; or
- 5) disclosed by the Discloser to another without obligation of confidentiality.

General

This Agreement does not require either of us to disclose or to receive Information. Neither of us may assign, or otherwise transfer, its rights or delegate its duties or obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent. Any attempt to do so is void.

The receipt of Information under this Agreement will not in any way limit the Recipient from:

- 1) providing to others products or services which may be competitive with products or services of the
- 2) providing products or services to others who compete with the Discloser; or
- 3) assigning its employees in any way it may choose.

The Recipient will 1) comply with all applicable export and import laws and regulations, including associated embargo and sanction regulations, and 2) unless authorized by applicable governmental license or regulation, not directly or indirectly export or re-export any technical information or software subject to this Agreement (including direct products of such technical information or software) to any prohibited destination or country (including release to nationals, wherever they may be located, of any prohibited country) as specified in such applicable export regulations.
